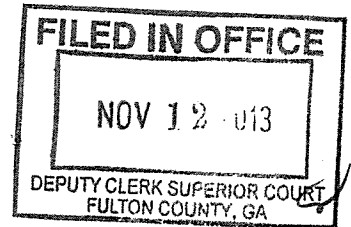

ORDER

On November 4, 2013, this matter came before the Court for a hearing on PLAINTIFF'S MOTION FOR CONTEMPT OR, IN THE ALTERNATIVE, RENEWED INJUNCTIVE RELIEF. Defendants began their argument by announcing to the Court that the Atlanta City Council had passed a new vending ordinance. In addition to creating a new vending program, this new vending ordinance also simultaneously repealed the prior vending ordinance,<sup>1</sup> which this Court ordered Defendants to abide by in its October 8, 2013 Order. (Order 5, Oct. 8, 2013). With the ordinance that formed the basis of Plaintiff's Motion and of this Court's prior Order now repealed, the matter before the Court is moot.<sup>2</sup>

Based on the above, PLAINTIFF'S MOTION FOR CONTEMPT OR, IN THE ALTERNATIVE, RENEWED INJUNCTIVE RELIEF is DENIED in its entirety as moot.

<sup>1</sup> A copy of the new ordinance, signed by Mayor Reed, was presented to the Court by Defendants. Plaintiff did not object to this introduction and acknowledged the impact that the ordinance had on the matter.

<sup>2</sup> The Court notes that both parties agreed during oral argument that the passage of the new vending ordinance, and the repeal of the existing vending ordinance, made Plaintiff's Motion for Contempt moot.
