Congratulations on your success. Yes, if you moved to a commercial building you would be considered a private school. The application for this is at this link: [Home \(nv.gov\)](#). The application you complete will depend on whether you meet the requirements as an exempt school or not. You can find those options here: [Declaration of Exemption \(nv.gov\)](#). Either way the most time consuming part is the safety and health inspections that must be completed on the building. To give you some additional information, once NDE receives your application, it takes approximately 60 days for final review and approval by the State Board. The initial license is good for two years.

Once you look over the applications, if you have further questions, my assistant or I will be happy to meet and answer any questions you may have.
